### Note:

- The tuition fees payable for the full 4 year programme (theory & practicals), if paid separately for each course totals Rs. 144,000. However, you could pay only Rs. 85,000 in advance for the full programme and not pay any tuition fees thereafter. This represents a massive discount of 42%. If this fee is paid by 31.12.08 a further discount of Rs. 15,000 will be given and only Rs. 70,000 (52% discount) is then payable as tuition fees for the full programme.
- If the entire refundable deposit is paid by 15.01.09, only Rs. 85,000 will be payable instead of Rs. 90,000 (7% discount) paid in two installments payable by 31.01.09.**
- At least two Entrance Scholarships and several Merit Bursaries will be awarded on a Test to be held in February 2009 for all registered students at Level 1.
- Examination fees are payable annually in addition to the above payments. At current (2008) rates these amount to a sum of Rs. 59,500 for all theory and practical examinations over a four year period.

## OVERALL COST OF THE GRADUATESHIP PROGRAMME

On the basis of the information given above, the overall cost of following the Graduateship Programme in Chemistry will be as follows, **if paid in advance at initial registration:-**

4 year early bird Registration Fee (before <b>30.11.08</b> )	= Rs. 50,000	} Rs. 120,000
Composite early bird tuition Fees (for 4 years) for all theory and practical courses (before <b>31.12.08</b> )	= Rs. 70,000	

The normal composite tuition fee required would be Rs. 85,000 if paid by 31.01.09 & the total cost for registration (Rs. 60,000) and tuition fees would then be Rs. 145,000.

### Note:-

- The above does not include the refundable deposits (see above) and Examination fees (presently a total of Rs. 49,500)
- Tuition fees can however be paid annually but the total payment will be much more. (see above)
- By paying in advance, as indicated above, you will not be affected by annual increases in relevant fees.**
